This highly popular annual course is the 22nd in the series. It consists of lectures by international experts outstanding in the field of allergy. The programme covers current and emerging concepts as well as an overview of basic principles. Major themes include IgE and anaphylaxis, asthma, rhinitis and allergen immunotherapy, food allergy and drug allergy. In addition, newer therapeutic developments will be discussed. This year the 'Professor Barry Kay Lecture' will be given by Professor Claus Bachert.

The programme integrates basic science with new developments and provides an update on clinical aspects, basic mechanisms and recent advances in allergy, asthma and inflammation. The course is aimed at clinicians, scientists, and new researchers from a range of disciplines, including the pharmaceutical industry. It will also be of interest to clinical trainees in related specialities including immunology, respiratory medicine, ENT and dermatology.
