Summary of Guidance (Max 250 words)	 Naftidrofuryl oxalate is recommended as a treatment option for intermittent claudication in people with peripheral arterial disease for whom vasodilator therapy is considered appropriate after taking other treatment options into consideration. Naftidrofuryl oxalate treatment should be started with the least costly licensed preparation. Cilostazol, pentoxifylline and inositol nicotinate are not recommended for the treatment of intermittent claudication in people with peripheral arterial disease. People currently receiving Cilostazol, pentoxifylline and inositol nicotinate should have the option to continue
	treatment until they and their clinicians consider it appropriate to stop.
